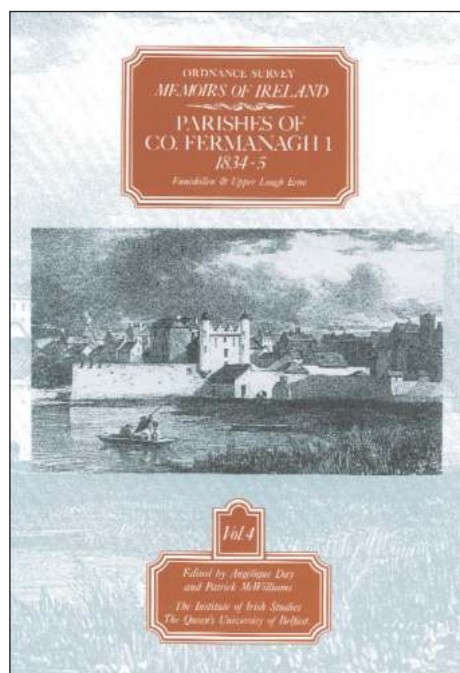


# Ordnance Survey Memoirs of Ireland

The Ordnance Survey Memoirs of Ireland provide a uniquely detailed history of the northern half of Ireland immediately before the Great Famine. The Memoirs were written in the 1830s, to accompany the 6-inch Ordnance Survey Maps, yet, except for the Parish of Templemore, Co. Londonderry, they were not actually published at the time. In the 1990s the Institute of Irish Studies at Queen's University Belfast, published the memoirs in forty volumes, covering the northern counties of Ireland.

The Memoirs act as a nineteenth-century Domesday Book, and are essential to the understanding of the cultural heritage of our communities. They document the landscape and situation, buildings and antiquities, land holdings and population, employment and livelihood of the parishes. Importantly, for many parishes in counties Antrim and Londonderry they provide the names of emigrants during this period, the year they left and the port to which they emigrated. Learn not just about the houses of your ancestors, but the type of work they did, the schools they were educated in, the churches where they worshipped, the roads they got about on, and more.

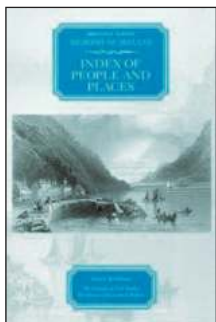
